What subjects did you study for the HSC?

English Advanced, Chemistry, Physics, Maths Extension 1 and Maths Extension 2

Which was your favourite subject and why?

My favourite was Maths Extension 2, I have loved learning about new, abstract and complex ideas and the way they all apply. How everything connects is just amazing to me. My motivation to learn this year has come from my desire to understand things, why some particular physical phenomenon occurs or why a certain maths application applied to something. Curiosity to learn and understand is what has really driven me this year.

What has been one of your proudest School achievements?

Getting my ATAR. The morning I received my results, I was super nervous: I had been up all night and had not had much sleep. I had a specific number in my head of 98, which is what I needed to get into the course I wanted. But at 9am, when I opened my results on the computer, I was absolutely speechless. The result was way above what I had thought I could ever achieve. My sister recorded the whole thing on her phone, which I still haven't watched back yet, but I remember I was just so over the moon. It was real validation that all my hard work had absolutely paid off.

How was your experience of Remote Learning?

I found remote learning due to the COVID-19 lockdown challenging. That said, I knew we were very lucky and felt very fortunate as the School was very prepared for remote learning. I realised over the course of the year that I can overcome challenges like remote learning. Whilst it wasn't for me, I did get through it and I did go on to work hard and overcoming that situation has definitely taught me resilience.

What co-curricular or other activities/practices did you do to balance your commitment to your studies?

I took part in a variety of co-curricular activities at Pittwater House to balance with my academics. The main ones included Cadets and SRC (Student Representative Council).

What have been some of the highlights of your time at Pittwater House?

There are too many highlights from my time at School to name all of them, but a handful would certainly include all the Cadet camps, going on the band tour and walking out of Graduation Hall at the end of Year 12.

How have your teachers contributed to your success?

I'm so thankful for my teachers. Not just what I was able to learn from them during my classes but outside as well. What advice would you give future students undertaking their HSC?

The advice I would give to next year's HSC students is find what works best for you. I found that I work best in a relaxed state. For example, the night before an exam, I would sit down and simply relax and the morning of an exam I would not be cramming. But that's not for everyone. If you think you work better under pressure, then create that environment for yourself.

Overall, how would you describe your time at the School?

My time at Pittwater House has been absolutely amazing and I'm going to miss the School so much. I can still remember playing water polo in Year 7 and those were some of the best times.

What has been one of your proudest school achievements?

My proudest achievement at Pittwater House is undoubtedly becoming the Dux of the Girls' College this year. I'm particularly proud of having achieved my ATAR through a more unconventional way, studying subjects such as Dance, which I achieved as an accelerated Year 11 student, as well as more rigorous academic subjects and getting the grade for my preferred course at university.

Pittwater House is structured to provide students with largely single-sex classes within a co-ed school campus, gradually moving to a full co-ed education in Years 11 and 12. What do you think are the benefits of this structure?

I hugely benefited from the single-sex classes through Years 7 to 10. The structure encouraged a more comfortable learning environment in my adolescence as my College friends and I were developing and maturing differently (to the boys). By Years 11 and 12, the interests and motivations of my peers in the classroom became much more aligned with Grammar students, enhancing the learning environment further.

What has inspired you/motivated you during 2020?

Throughout my final year, I have been motivated and inspired by the hard work and dedication of my friends and peers, where the healthy competition has pushed us to all do our best.

What co-curricular or other activities/practices did you do to balance your commitment to your studies?

During my time at School there were inevitably many ups and downs, however, the classroom was a reliable constant, as the teachers were so understanding. Whether it be out of school commitments, or the stress of the workload becoming too overwhelming at times, the teachers were always extremely adaptive and accommodating when supporting a student to reach their personal goals. I've been at Pittwater House since Kindergarten. I feel like having the single-sex classes, particularly in Years 7 and 8, really helped me develop my confidence as I created really strong bonds with the girls in my class and created an environment where I was ready to speak up and ask questions. The integration to co-ed classes prepared me for the real world where I would have to work with all different types of people.

What subjects did you study for the HSC?

What was your favourite subject?


What has been your proudest school achievement?
