# Senior School Co-curricular Activities



**The broad co-curricular offering at Pittwater House caters for a diverse range of interests and provides students with the opportunity to develop their talents beyond the classroom.**

Many of our Senior School co-curricular activities build on those offered in the Junior School and allow students to continue to enhance their talents or develop new skills.

The School's programs are run by qualified staff and in many instances external professionals who have excelled in their relevant professions in sporting, the arts and military fields.

### **Leadership and Outdoor Education**

Pittwater House has an extensive leadership program in the Boys' Grammar School and Girls' College: Year Prefects, Student Representative Council and other leadership opportunities are also available. All students can become school leaders after completing a two to three year Leaders Program. This program helps students develop the confidence, skills and knowledge to be a good leader.

Outdoor Education is also a critical area that helps students build leadership skills and confidence and is available to all Senior School students. The program is structured so students work together in small groups and deal directly with concepts such as leadership, inclusiveness and the value of working towards a common goal.





## Youth Development Programs and Expeditions

Pittwater House students have the opportunity to participate in The Duke of Edinburgh Award. Open to students aged 14 and over, The Award is a structured youth development program in which participants must learn a skill, improve their physical well-being, volunteer in their community and experience a team adventure in a new environment. The Award consists of three levels - Bronze, Silver and Gold - each progressively more challenging.

In addition to The Duke of Edinburgh Award, students in Years 9, 10 and 11 can also opt to participate in ten-day immersion programs to remote Indigenous Australia with Red Earth School Immersions. On these developmental journeys, students learn from Traditional Custodians who have a deep connection with their culture and history, raising funds for and working on projects that benefit host communities.

## Music and the Arts

The study of music, performing arts and dance allows for the expression of emotion, imagination, the intellect and the exploration of values.

Through these pursuits, students are given the opportunity to develop both their self-confidence and skills.

We offer a wide range of dance, drama and music opportunities for beginner, intermediate and advanced levels including private tuition, ensembles membership and performance at community and school events.

In addition to curriculum subjects to HSC level, performing arts and dance are offered to Senior School students as a co-curricular option to further develop their performance skills. We have a variety of events in which Senior School students can get involved, including the musical production, performing arts festivals and other events.

## Sports

Sport plays a significant role in the life of Pittwater House students and as such we offer a variety of co-curricular sporting activities and competitive sporting opportunities throughout the year. With experienced coaches on hand, our students' skills are cultivated to allow them to reach their full potential.

Pittwater House students also benefit from many 'on-campus facilities' such as a swimming pool, large multi-purpose playing field, an indoor sports complex and tennis, basketball and netball courts.

## Clubs and Academic Competitions

From chess to theatre sports, Pittwater House students have the opportunity to be involved in a variety of clubs and academic competitions to test their skills and cultivate their interests. A summary of the types of clubs and competitions on offer is listed within this brochure.

## Cadets

Our Army Cadet Unit embodies a tradition of service - to the community and to our School.

A voluntary program for students aged 13 and over, the Cadet Unit teaches students a variety of skills such as navigation, fieldcraft, leadership and team building.

Our Cadet Unit provides support to local RSL groups from Manly to Avalon, taking part in ANZAC services, ceremonial parades and a number of important School functions.
